Since 1997, the James Hillier Foundation has bestowed scholarships for university to Brant County high school students wishing to pursue a career in scientific research. This year marks the 21st year for the program and to date 62 local students have been awarded university scholarships. At the conclusion of this year, the Foundation will have awarded over \$1,000,000.
