
Dear Hillier Scholarship Recipients;

Since 1997, the James Hillier Foundation has bestowed scholarships for university to Brantford and Brant County high school students wishing to pursue a career in scientific research. This year marks the 27th year for the program and including this year's recipients, 86 local students have been awarded university scholarships. To date, the Foundation has provided over \$1,400,000 in scholarships.

2024 Scholarship Recipients

This year, the Foundation was pleased to offer four scholarships. High school students Nicholas Emmons-Zamorano, from St. Johns College, Leopoldo Mendoza from Assumption College, Cordelia Simmons and Lilly Song both from North Park Collegiate are the recipients of full four-year \$20,000 scholarships from the James Hillier Foundation.

A Conversation with past recipient Jeremy Gooden

Jeremy Gooden was a 2012 James Hillier Grant recipient. He graduated from The Stephen J.R. Smith Faculty of Engineering and Applied Science at Queen's University with an Engineering Chemistry Degree. Since graduation, he has had a wide variety of work experiences. Today, he is a Director at Altas Partners, a Canadian private equity firm, in the Portfolio Solutions Group where he works with management teams of portfolio companies to drive performance and profitability.

He is an elected member of the Board of Trustees and University Council at Queen's University, which are two of the university's three governing and advisory bodies. He is also a Fellow of the Black Wealth Club, an organization helping Canada's top emerging Black leaders to build wealth and reinvest in their communities. In 2022, the university interviewed him for his views on the impact of scholarships & bursaries on students' lives.
